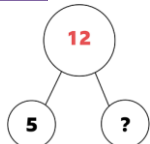
Dear Parents and Carers,

We have had a wonderful week and enjoyed our cricket coaching sessions. The children have worked hard at using adjectives to describe vegetables and have used ordinal numbers in their maths.

English: This week we will be reading the story 'Have you Filled a Bucket Today?' by Carol McCloud.

Phonics: We will be introducing the Phase 5 digraphs starting with 'ay', 'ou', 'ie', 'ea' and 'oy'. Do look out for new keyrings with these sounds which will be coming home this week.

Maths: We will be introducing part, part whole models and looking at the mathematical symbols + and =.



Science: We will continue to look at our senses.

Art: We will be creating our own Picasso inspired portraits.

PSHE: We will have a focus on our own well-being next week as part of 'Feel Good Week'.
